1. Policy Statement

Wiley Park Public School aims to provide a safe, caring and welcoming learning place where all students and staff are treated with respect. Staff, students and parents share responsibility to ensure active support of the School Uniform Policy.

2. Benefits of School Uniforms

(as outlined in *School Uniforms in NSW Government Schools 2004*)

It has been found that the wearing of school uniform brings with it many benefits such as:

- defining an identity for the school within the local community;
- developing students' sense of belonging to the school community;
- providing an opportunity to build school spirit;
- enhancing the health and safety of students when involved in school activities;
- promoting a sense of inclusiveness, non-discrimination and equal opportunity;
- reinforcing the perception of the school as an ordered and safe environment;
- increasing the personal safety of students and staff by allowing easier recognition of visitors and potential intruders in the school;
- promoting positive community perceptions of public education; and
- making school clothing more affordable for families by eliminating the risk of peer pressure to wear transiently fashionable and expensive clothes.

3. Our Beliefs

The wearing of school uniforms by students will assist the Wiley Park Public School community in:

- promoting the school's image within the community;
- enhancing school spirit;
- encouraging unity and equality between students;
- increasing student confidence;
- cost-saving for parents; and
- preparing students for dress and safety codes required by employers.

4. Collaboration and Consultation

At Wiley Park Public School, the uniform has been designed in partnership with the P&C, staff and students. It is our intention that the uniform reflects the needs of students, their families and the school.

5. Uniform Requirements

Teachers, students, parents and caregivers work together to encourage students to wear full school uniform.

- Shoes – Black, flat, leather or vinyl enclosed shoes. No canvas shoes or coloured soles/laces.
- Beanies, neck scarves, gloves – Beanies do not form part of the uniform. Neck scarves and gloves are to be bottle green and free of logo, slogan or pattern.
- Jewellery - Watches are acceptable. Girls' earrings should be small studs with only one earring permitted in each ear. No other jewellery is to be worn.
- Hair, nails and make-up – Haircuts should be neat and tidy. Long hair is to be pulled back off the face. Over-styled hair, including mohawks, mullets, rat-tails, under cuts, shave patterns, bleached or dyed hair is not acceptable. Make-up and nail polish are not permitted. Hair accessories are to be white or bottle green.

6. Uniform Policy / Responsibilities

This Uniform Policy will be actively supported by the School and its Parent community by recognising respective responsibilities.

School Responsibilities

- Wiley Park Public School will make the uniform available through external suppliers. Hats can be purchased from the school.
- Negotiate and liaise with the P&C in matters relating to the management of the Uniform Policy.
- Families who are experiencing financial difficulty are encouraged to contact the school.
- When available, second hand uniforms can be purchased from the school office.

Parent Responsibilities

- Support the school Uniform Policy by providing children with all items of uniform.
- Write a letter of explanation if student is not in uniform.

7. School Uniform Management

Repeated and unexplained failure to wear full school uniform will result in a parent interview and a possible level drop in accordance with the Student Welfare and Discipline Policy.
