School Procedures



School Hours

School hours are **9:00am - 3:00pm**

All students must present to their class line up area at **9:00am**

Morning supervision starts at **8.30am**.

Communication

If you wish to speak to your child's teacher, please contact the school to make an appointment for a suitable time

School reports are released each year at the end of Term Two and Term Four

Parent Teacher Interviews will be held in Term Two – date to be confirmed

Attendance



- If your child is sick or absent, parents are required to **explain the absence**. A written note, doctor's certificate or phone call is sufficient
- If your child is absent for 3 or more days a medical certificate is required upon their return
- We want all students to be at school on time, every day.

Lateness

- Your child needs to be at school by 9:00am. Every time your child is late, you need to accompany your child to the office, where the partial absence and reason for absence will be recorded.

Reasons for absences and lateness

Attendance is followed up by the Home School Liaison Officer. The reasons for absences or lateness must be acceptable to the Department of Education.

Compulsory school attendance

Information for parents

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. NSW public schools work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

What are my Legal responsibilities?

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and below the minimum school leaving age of 17 years. The Education Act 1990 requires that parents ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at, and regularly attend school, or, are registered with the NSW Education and Standards Authority for home schooling.

Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.

The Importance of arriving on time

Arriving at school and class on time:

- Ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day
- Helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- Give students time to greet their friends before class
- Reduces classroom disruption

Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by parents.

What if my child has to be away from school?

On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick, or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstance (e.g. attending a funeral)

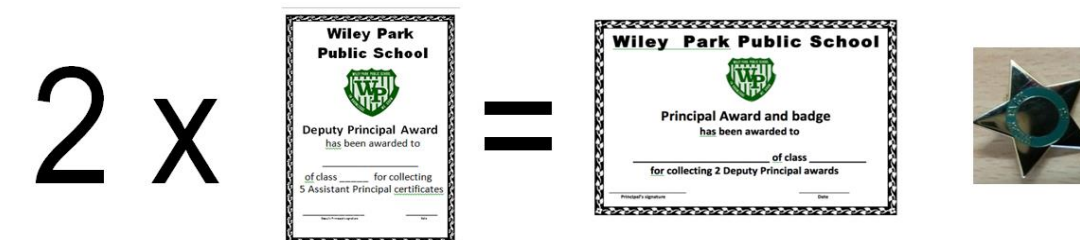
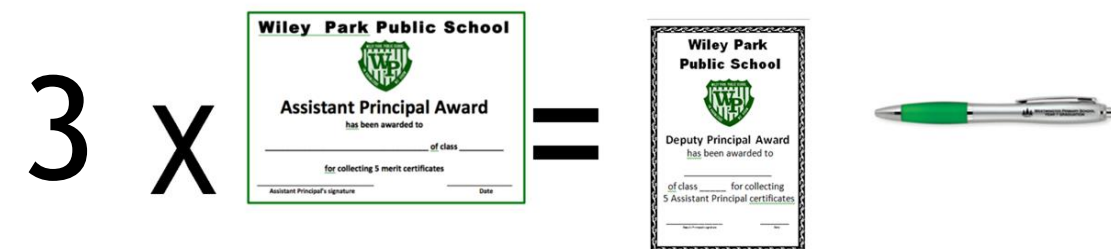
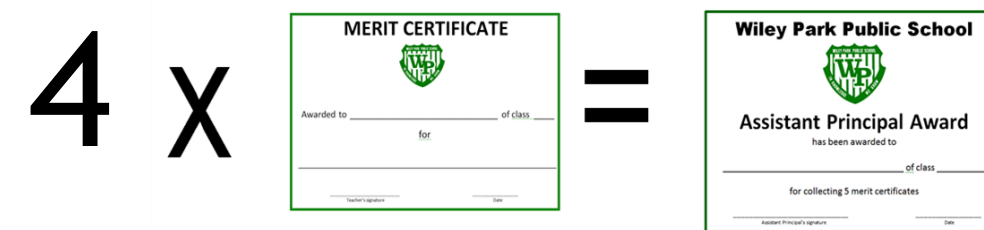

Supporting Student Wellbeing

Consequences of Negative Behaviour

- When children fail to follow the **class rules**, a **red card** may be filled out. These are valid for two weeks
- When children fail to follow **school rules** on the playground, a **blue card** may be filled out
- Students who fall below Bronze level may have their privileges taken away eg performances, class privileges, in-school visits and excursions

RED CARD – CLASSROOM – DETENTION
