

MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL





ELECTIONS - DATE EXTENSION

The executive committee is the leadership team that steers the association and sub committees towards their goals. It consists of the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and up to 6 elected Association members.

NOMINATION FORMS CAN BE PICKED UP FROM THE OFFICE OR DOWNLOADED FROM OUR WEBSITE. All nomination forms need to be handed in to the office by Monday 7 April with a gold coin

Below is a list of roles to be nominated on and their role description :

- President The President has the responsibility to ensure the successful functioning of the association. This includes achieving its goals, encouraging fair participation of all members and adherence to the constitution. They must run (Chair) all meetings and may represent the association at official functions and act as the association spokesperson.
- Vice President The Vice President assists the President to lead and support the committee. If the President is unable to perform any of their duties, the Vice President will be asked to stand in their place.
- Secretary The Secretary is the administrative officer of the association. They are required to attend all meetings, write the meeting agenda (in consultation with the President) and take notes during the meeting to produce the minutes of the meeting. It is the secretary's responsibility to keep records of correspondence and other information.
- Treasurer The Treasurer is responsible for sound financial management of the association. The treasurer keeps records of all monies in and out and must present a formal financial statement at every meeting.
- Other Positions Often other committees such as fundraising committees are formed. Members of these committees are responsible for conducting the set objectives of that committee. Once the set objectives are reached that committee may no longer be required. Extra support may also be required from time to time to assist with special events.



HOW TO USE SCHOOL BYTES

The school uses School Bytes to accept payments for things such as an excursion and in school visits.

Download the School Bytes app from your app store.



Press on Create an account.

An email will be sent to the email address nominated so that you can verify your access.


IMPORTANT: To ensure that the registration process works smoothly, and you can link your account to your child/ren, make sure that you use the same email address that you have provided to the school.

Once account is created you will need to go into the app to login. Once logged in it should ask for your child/ren's name, school, grade & date of birth.

Once your child/ren is found you can make payments through the app, by going into **Payments**. This will then take you to everything that is owing for child/ren.

Please note: Transactions made through the online payment portal will appear on your bank statement as **OSCHOOLSONLINE 0000 PARRAMATTA AU.**

What Does Anxiety Look Like in Children?

Children With Anxiety May...



Feeling anxious is normal for kids, and it can even help them in some situations. When anxiety is manageable, it can prepare your child for challenges and help them build confidence and strength.

But anxiety can be a problem when it affects your child's daily life. Signs of unhealthy anxiety include feeling more anxious than other kids, not wanting to go to school or hang out with friends and having fears that seem too big for what is happening.

Teach Your Child how to Breathe


If your child is feeling anxious, you can help them by teaching them how to breathe. This method is simple, but it works very well.

Ask your child to place their hand on the part of their body that feels anxious. Then, they should take deep, slow breaths and pay attention to that spot. If their mind starts to wander or think of other things, gently remind them to focus on their breathing. You can tell your child:


When we feel anxious, we often start to worry and think about bad things that might happen. These thoughts can make us feel even more worried. That's why it is important to pay attention to our breathing instead. Focusing on our breath can help us feel safe and calm.
























60 have been inspired by their study of the book "Storm Boy" by Colin Thiele to build models of the characters and environments in the story.


