
Next term we will be holding our annual Athletics Carnival on Tuesday 28 May, all students are expected to attend. Parents and carers are invited to this event so please keep this day free.



Touch Football and Netball will be played at Clemton Park.


Boys Soccer will be played at Rudd Park.

A small group of Year 6 students have commenced preparing the school garden bed for planting. Gardening is open to Stage 3 students on Monday lunchtimes from 11:20. Autumn is a fabulous time of the year for gardening, either in the backyard or a few pots on the balcony. Now that the weather has cooled off and the recent rain has helped with wetting the soil, it's easy to plant a wide variety of vegetables such as radishes, peas, lettuces, cabbages, broccoli or beetroot. Many of these vegetable varieties can be planted from seed or seedlings which can be purchased from your local nursery store or Bunnings. When planting in pots remember to use a good quality potting mix and change the potting mix every two years to ensure healthy plant growth.

3-6 students who place first or second in their School Finals Competition will go on to represent the school at the Multicultural Perspectives Public Speaking Competition later in Term 2.



In Science students across Stage 2 and 3 have been learning about Earth and Space. This is a fascinating topic where students will explore some amazing facts about our Sun, Earth and Moon. It is incredible to think that our Sun is approximately 150 000 000 kilometers from Earth, and it takes sunlight 8 minutes and 20 seconds to reach Earth. 
We are S-T
